

ANCYL denies being involved in IFP battle

DURBAN — Inkatha Freedom Party leader Mangosuthu Buthelezi should publicly apologise to the ANCYL for allegedly accusing it of being involved in problems facing the party, the league said yesterday.

"The ANCYL in KwaZulu-Natal has learnt with great shock [of] the blatant, totally unproven allegations made by IFP president Mr G Buthelezi that it is directly involved in the IFP internal crisis," it said in a statement.

The ANCYL said it rejected the "unfounded accusations" and asked Buthelezi to publicly apologise for the alleged statement.

IFP national organiser Albert Mncwango said the party would issue a statement on the matter.

"We will further accuse the

"We never said anything when the ANC had succession battles.

"They must keep their noses out of the IFP," he said.

The IFP has been at loggerheads with its chairwomen Zanele Magwaza-Msthi.

She approached the court last year to prevent the party from holding a disciplinary enquiry against her, and to order the party to hold its elective conference, which had been postponed six times since July last year.

The Pietermaritzburg High Court dismissed Magwaza-Msthi's application with costs on Monday.

Her supporters claim she was being prevented from taking part in the race to succeed Buthelezi. — Sapa.
